President's Letter



Dear Members and Friends,

Holiday best wishes to all involved in the Charles County Arts Alliance!

Over the past six months, we of the CCAA Board and many of our members have completed a large number of arts activities. We have participated in a Board retreat, five Board meetings and held two "Meet the Artists" public receptions. Along the way we also commemorated the War of 1812 British invasion at Benedict, set up and supervised the P. D. Brown Building during the Charles County Fair, and provided financial support for the music entertainment also presented at the Fair.

Next we held a grant workshop, convened a grant panel to evaluate applications presented to us by schools and nonprofit arts organizations, and approved and awarded over \$43,000 in grant funds at our Gala at Old Waldorf School.

Scholarship funds were raised at the Gala by way of a silent auction, as well as by the artist registration fees and artworks donated from those who participated in the Holiday Arts Faire, at the Kris Kringle Christmas Market in early December. Closing the first half of our operational year was an additional scholarship fundraiser, the "Holiday Fashion Show and ShopFest" held at Chico's in Waldorf from which we received 10% of the sales between 11:00 am and 1:00 pm, on December 13.

We still have another six months ahead of us with many more activities and challenges to meet as we continue to serve the citizens of Charles County.

Maryland State Arts Council The Maryland Cultural Data Report



The nonprofit arts industry in Maryland has a \$1.07 billion annual economic impact in our state. How do we know?

Because all MSAC grantee organizations submit their financial data to the Maryland Cultural Data Project (MDCDP) each year.

The MDCDP then generates a report that is submitted to the MSAC along with each grant application from an organization or County Arts Council. In turn, the MSAC tracks and measures the annual economic impact of the arts in Maryland, releasing a comprehensive report each year. The report shows legislators and other stakeholders in Maryland that the arts mean jobs and business across our entire state.

Maryland CDP is a required part of Maryland State Arts Council (MSAC) Grants for Organizations (GFO) Track I and Track II applications, and Community Arts Development (CAD) applications. Now operating in 12 states and DC, the Cultural Data Project is an emerging national standard that gathers reliable data on arts and cultural organizations to provide consistent, reliable, comprehensive data on arts and culture in Maryland and nationally.

The Cultural Data Project (CDP)'s mission is to strengthen the national nonprofit arts and cultural sector by collecting and disseminating comprehensive, high-quality longitudinal data that supports fact-based decision-making in three key ways:

- It helps arts and cultural organizations improve their financial management and services to their communities.
- It enables researchers, advocates and policy makers to better tell the story of the sector's assets, contributions and needs.
- It helps grantmakers more effectively plan for and evaluate their individual and collective grantmaking activities.

The CDP impacts the cultural community in the following ways:

- Individual arts and cultural organizations improve their financial and operational capacity to serve their constituents better.
- Fact-based information advances learning and exchange among the cultural sector, policymakers and civic leaders.
- Funders plan for and evaluate their individual and collective grantmaking activities more effectively.

The CDP was operated by The Pew Charitable Trusts until 2013, and is now an independent 501(c)(3) nonprofit with a national board of directors and governance structure.





encapsulate the mountainous wilderness and paralyze the search for her. While police suspect Jeff of "instant divorce," Emory, suffering from an unexplained head injury, regains consciousness and finds herself the captive of a man whose violent past is so dark that he won't even tell her his name. She's determined to escape him, and willing to take any risks necessary to survive. Combining the nail-biting suspense and potent storytelling that has made Sandra Brown one of the world's best loved authors, *Mean Streak* is a wildly compelling novel about love, deceit, and the choices we must make in order to survive.



Funny, heartbreaking, and lyrical, *The Distance Between Us* poignantly captures the confusion and contradictions of childhood, reminding us that the joys and sorrows we experience are imprinted on the heart forever, calling out to us of those places we first called home.



Rex and Rose Mary Walls had four
children. In the beginning, they
lived like nomads, moving among

in the mountains. Rex was a

charismatic, brilliant man who, when sober, captured his children's imagination, teaching them physics, geology, and above all, how to embrace life fearlessly. Rose Mary, who painted and wrote and couldn't stand the responsibility of providing for her family, called herself an "excitement addict." As the dysfunction of the family escalated, Jeannette and her brother and sisters had to fend for themselves, supporting one another as they weathered their parents' betrayals and, finally, found the resources and will to leave home.

Henry is forced to leave town—with Brown, who believes he's a girl. An absorbing mixture of history and imagination, and told with McBride's meticulous eye for detail and character, *The Good Lord Bird* is both a rousing adventure and a moving exploration of identity and survival.


