

Jan Garland creates 2-D displays of characters, scenes, thoughts and emotions with glue, and torn bits of tissue paper or cut plastic bags with an emphasis on recycled materials. She uses recycled tissue paper from gift boxes and bags, and with a little glue and water, they become images. Plastic bags from

products and stores are used in the same way and help save the landfill from the potential toxic breakdown that is harmful to the environment.

Jan has been chosen for multiple juried shows, including the Maryland Park and Planning "Memories From All Directions," the Bowie City Hall "Belair at Bowie," as well as the Charles County Arts Alliance, National Park Service and the Thomas Stone National Historical Site "Habre de Venture: Dwelling Place of the Arts."

Most recently, Jan's art has been chosen for display at the House of Delegates Office Building in Annapolis, the Department of Environmental Resources, and the Montpelier Arts Center.

ArtsFest 2015 is Coming! Calling all artists, authors, and exhibitors!

The Charles County Arts Alliance is pleased to announce our 23rd annual ArtsFest, to be held on Saturday, June 13, 2015, from 11:00 am - 5:00 pm, on the beautiful grounds of the La Plata Town Hall, in La Plata, Maryland. ArtsFest is the largest arts festival in Charles County, and one of the largest in Southern Maryland. We are pleased to be presenting ArtsFest for the fourth year in partnership with the Town of La Plata.

ArtsFest is our annual outdoor celebration of all the arts and artists - visual, literary and performing. It is our "free gift" to the citizens of Charles County and Southern Maryland, and there is no charge for the public to attend. It is a family-friendly, wonderful way to kick off the summer season! Great food and Southern Maryland specialties will be available for purchase throughout the day.

Visual and literary artists of all media are invited to display and sell their works. In addition, nonprofit arts organizations are invited as exhibitors to display information and encourage participation in their performing, visual and literary arts activities. Also invited as nonprofit exhibitors are cultural, historical, heritage and environmental organizations.

As of this writing, 41 artists vendors will be on hand, offering jewelry, paintings, photography, woven baskets, wood puzzles, barnwood decorations, fine yarns, ornaments, coasters, hand-knitted shawls, ceramic sculptures, painted glassware, pottery, hand-painted signs, wooden bowls and plates, children's books, Native American items, and more. Food will be plentiful, with eight vendors selling Thai food, New Orleans style selections, Maryland stuffed ham and chicken salad sandwiches, jerk chicken, half smokes, fries, funnel cakes, kettle corn, flavored peanuts, shaved ice cones, lemonade, sodas and water.

Nonstop music and dance performances on two stages will be provided by a Korean dance troupe and 8 music groups. Educational exhibitors and local authors autographing their books, and a Kid's Art Tent with a wide variety of hands-on creative projects round out the variety of sights and sounds at ArtsFest!

World Premiere of "Haara" on May 18-19

New Music for Symphonic Band by Mary Coy Whitmore, Composer and Lackey High School Graduate Partnership of Charles County Arts Alliance / Charles County Public Schools

On May 18-19, 2015, a very special and rare event will occur in Charles County - the world premiere of a new musical work for symphonic band. The work is entitled, *Haara*, and was composed by Mary Coy Whitmore, a 2007 graduate of Henry E. Lackey High School.

"Haara" is the phonetic transcription of the Arabic word meaning "free," and this musical composition is being dedicated to the high school bands of Charles County, Maryland. The project was conceived and spearheaded by Alan D. Freeman, Director of Instrumental Music at Lackey High School, who was Ms. Whitmore's former band director. It was commissioned as the result of a special project grant awarded in 2013 by the Charles County Arts Alliance to the Charles County Public Schools. Work on this unique composition began during fall 2013, and was completed in May 2014.

Three world premiere concerts will take place at Charles County high schools over two evenings, with free admission at each:

- Lackey High School: May 18 at 6:30 pm
- La Plata High School: May 18 at 6:30 pm
- North Point High School: May 19 at 7:00 pm



Ms. Whitmore is a graduate of Henry E. Lackey High School (2007) and of St. Mary's College of Maryland (Bachelor of Arts in Music, 2011). She has performed both locally and internationally as a bassoonist and a singer. She began composing in 2009 during her undergraduate degree, and received several premieres, notably: *Muse: Two Contemplations for Horn and Piano* for the St. Mary's County Arts Council board of directors in 2010; and *Mirage* for Orchestra. The latter was performed at the 2011 season of the River Concert Series at St. Mary's College. Her former college composition mentors include David Froom, John Leupold and Robert Gibson. Her former music teachers in the Charles County Public Schools are James Kundreskas, Robert Rausch, Paul Donelly and Alan Freeman. After the completion of her Master of Music Composition degree this year at the University of Maryland, College Park, Ms. Whitmore will be continuing her studies there as a candidate for Doctorate of Musical Arts.



Alan D. Freeman, Ed.D., is the Director of Instrumental Music at Henry E. Lackey High School. He offers a positive assessment of the composition and the composer:

"When Mary was a student at Lackey High School, she was already a terrific musician. She was a bassoonist but played multiple instruments. She was also an accomplished vocalist. She was in symphonic band, jazz band, marching band, choir and even sang lead in the school musical. Haara is her first composition for band. We are in rehearsals for the piece now. It's creative, original and dramatic. She already has an impressive command of the medium. I look forward to hearing the finished product and I hope this is only the first of many compositions to come."

General Assembly Adjourns: Arts Funding Restored!

At 11:59 p.m. on Monday, April 13, the Maryland General Assembly adjourned SINE DIE! With the help of hundreds of nonprofit arts organizations and thousands of citizen advocates, Maryland Citizens for the Arts (MCA) succeeded in convincing the Maryland General Assembly to reverse the \$800,000 mid-year FY 2015 cut to the State arts grant, and to restore the proposed cut of nearly \$1.4 million to the FY 2016 State arts budget.



These results represent a \$2.2 million improvement in arts funding

for the current and next fiscal years in comparison to the budget proposed in January. This also means that for FY 2016 Maryland will reach a new record level of support for the arts through the Maryland State Arts Council (MSAC).

MCA is grateful for the leadership and support of the presiding officers, President Miller and Speaker Busch, Senate Budget & Taxation and House Appropriation committee and subcommittee chairs Sen. Kasemeyer, Sen. Madaleno, Del. McIntosh, Del. Proctor, Del. Jones, and Del. Barnes, as well as all the committee and sub-committee members responsible for these historic bipartisan actions.

MCA also thanks Governor Hogan and the leadership of the Department of Business and Economic Development for their encouragement, understanding, and appreciation of the importance of a strong arts sector in Maryland. We will continue to work with the Administration to ensure that Maryland supports and recognizes the critical role the arts play in an economically sound and culturally vibrant state.

In the weeks ahead, MSAC will clarify the sequencing and timing of the FY 2015 grant restoration.

against the looming horrors of the battlefield-weary, demoralized men marching in the rain during the German attack on Caporetto, and the profound struggle between loyalty and desertion, this gripping, semiautobiographical work captures the harsh realities of war and the pain of lovers caught in its inexorable sweep.
