Grant Season is Here! Applications Now Available!

Applications for FY2016 grants are now available! Over the past 28 years, the CCAA has awarded over \$600,000 in grant funding to schools and organizations in Charles County for projects in the performing, visual, and literary arts. This has helped enhance our county's culture and inspire its residents to explore the diverse arts community present in its own backyard. There are two types of grants: Arts in Education (AIE) for schools, and Community Arts Development (CAD) for nonprofit organizations. Some examples are arts services, children's events, dance, folk arts and heritage, literature, media, and music. Schools may request up to \$750, while nonprofit organizations may be eligible to receive up to \$6,000 in grant monies.

In 2005, Vicki was awarded her Bachelor of Science in Visual Arts. As an honors student, she studied art and architecture in Italy and the Netherlands.

Vick has enjoyed teaching art classes at Lackey High School in Indian Head, Maryland for over 10 years. She strives to create innovative lessons and pair them with field trips to galleries and museums in Washington, DC and New York City. As sponsor of the National Art Honors Society, Vicki workw with students to further develop their understanding and appreciation for art while making the school's environment more visually stimulating. Her career as an educator has shown her the tangible value and lasting effects of being an

instructor and painter, and has helped to frame her understanding of the learning process and her ability to communicate the fundamental principles of the creation process.

In order to broaden my abilities and hone her technique, Vicki earned a Masters of Fine Arts from the Academy of Art University in 2012. During her studies in the masters program, she learned the value of studying under artists of varying styles and media. She actively began supplementing her collegiate studies with the artist workshop series sponsored by Jarrett Thor Fine Arts. Her involvement with those workshops opened up her exposure to the local arts community and several gallery openings, including several solo exhibitions as well as group and salon shows. Her artwork is in several private and public collections in the MD, DC, and VA area.

I was born to a 5th generation clan mother and Two-Spirit of the Cedarville Band, Wild Turkey Clan, of the Piscataway Conoy Nation. The Piscataway Conoy people have inhabited Maryland for over 10,000 years. I learned the traditions of the Piscataway Conoy culture.

Art is my way of release and expression. Healing also comes from music production, spending hours with Mother Earth, and artistic creation. My work has been featured in many exhibits within the DC area. I am a board member of the Cedarville Band of Piscataway Indians, Inc., producer for the traveling education program *Living the American Indian Experience*, a facilitator for health and wellness programs for Piscataway people, Chief Content Officer with the American Indian Cultural Center, and now a board member with the Charles County Arts Alliance. I was recently awarded a Master Artist's



Apprenticeship Grant by the Maryland State Arts Council. I am the subject of an in-production documentary: *A Safe Place*, documenting my life and role as an indigenous artist and Two-Spirit.

All of my expressions are created on the iPhone and iPad. This process includes photography and a wide variety of app work. This method is something I use to challenge my artistic abilities. My work is a colorful explosion of power and royalty; it strives to show the diversity and beauty in the multitude of Nations.







August 5: *The Namesake* by Jhumpa Lahiri. The Ganguli family struggles to transform from their tradition-bound life in Calcutta into becoming Americans. When their son is born, the task of naming him betrays the vexed results of bringing old ways to the new world. Named for a Russian writer by his Indian

parents in memory of a catastrophe years before, Gogol Ganguli knows only that he suffers the burden of his heritage as well as his odd, antic name. Lahiri brings great empathy to Gogol as he stumbles along the first-generation path, strewn with conflicting loyalties, comic detours, and wrenching love affairs. With penetrating insight, she reveals not only the defining power of the names and expectations bestowed upon us by our parents, but also the means by which we slowly, sometimes painfully, come to define ourselves.
