The evening began with antipasti and dinner from Rucci's and music by the Gretchen Richie Jazz Cabaret. CCAA Past President Diane Rausch welcomed all the guests to the Gala, and invited State Senator Thomas (Mac) Middleton to the stage to present a Resolution, followed by Charles County Commissioner President Peter Murply who proclaimed November 2017 as "Charles County Arts Alliance 30th Anniversary Month."

CCAA President Gale Kladitis continued the program and introduced Grant Chair Robert Rausch to present the FY 2018 grant awards to 6 schools and 13 nonprofit organizations (see page 5).

Gale then surprised Robert and Diane Rausch with a presentation of Lifetime Achievement Awards for their continuing dedication and efforts to promote all the arts since the beginning of an arts alliance in Charles County 30 years ago.

During the evening, guests had an opportunity to participate in a silent auction and donate toward three gift baskets. All proceeds benefit the CCAA Arts Scholarship Program.

The remaining evening was devoted to dessert by Gerard and dancing to the music of the Gretchen Richie Jazz Cabaret.

Founder's Letter

Dear Members and Friends of the Charles County Arts Alliance,

It is amazing to realize that the adage "Time flies" is a reality. The past 30 years of the Charles County Arts Alliance have passed exceedingly quickly. In the spring of 1987, a small group of concerned citizens were worried about the future of the then Charles County Arts Council (CCAC). The council's governance had been passed back-and-forth between the County Library and the County Recreation Department since 1972 and was no longer a viable organization. It was in July of that year that the Maryland State Arts Council received major funding which was to be passed on to the county arts councils. For Charles County, that meant an infusion of funding for the arts in the amount of \$42,000 per year from \$0 per year.

The new Board of the CCAC, totaling six members, determined that the old name must go! The Charles County Arts Alliance (CCAA) was born and incorporated. The new officers set a schedule for monthly meetings, revived the defunked monthly newsletter and sought memberships in the "new" organization. This resulted in some fifty people joining up in the first three months.



It is the people that have helped the CCAA to become an organization recognized as the "umbrella for the arts" in Charles County over the past thirty years. There have been more than 200 individuals who have served on the Board of Directors in this timeframe, membership has grown four-fold (even with the transient nature of our county) and thousands of children, artists, performers and literary and cultural devotees have benefited from our Arts in Education and Community Arts Development grants. Many people have demonstrated their support and loyalty to the CCAA by being officers and members for many years. Cindy Johnson served as a treasurer for 13 years; it was my honor to serve as one of eight presidents for a total of 14 years as well as a member for 30 years; CCAA co-founder, Diane Rausch, was President for 9 years. Our current president, Gale Kladitis has a membership that goes back to 1972 and the original CCAC, thus making her the longest continuous member of our organization.

With the dedication of people like those mentioned above and many others, the CCAA has promoted opera, ballet and theater for the enjoyment of our citizens, hosted the longest running outdoor arts festival in the region (25 years), and provided thousands of dollars for hundreds of artistic events covering visual and performing arts, as well as literary and cultural activities. None of our accomplishments would have been possible without the support of our office managers, the most outstanding of which is our current Office Manager, Judy Crawford.

As we close this calendar year, reflecting upon the past, but looking to the future, it is the wish of our Board of Directors that all our members and their families, and indeed all our county's citizens have a blessed, safe holiday season.

Tammy Lee Pantages, KACAF Chairwoman and President of the Korean American Association of Southern Maryland (KAASM), had invited the Arts Alliance to participate in the opening ceremony. During her presentation, Gale highlighted some of the projects sponsored by the Arts Alliance and added:

The mission of the Korean American Cultural Arts Foundation is to sponsor annual events that expose American audiences to the artistic elements of more than 5,000 years of Korea's cherished cultural heritage.

To this end the KACAF has presented 8 Lunar Festivals, 8 Asian/Pacific Festivals, 9 Korean-American Cultural Arts Festivals as well as fashion shows, art exhibitions, educational workshops and performances.

The continuing efforts of this organization to share the culture of Korea are self-evident, as they build a Korean Cultural Arts Center in Waldorf, Maryland. With more than 500 participants, representing every county in the state and Baltimore City, this statewide arts advocacy event connects artists, educators, administrators, volunteers and trustees with lawmakers from every legislative district in Maryland. Maryland Arts Day needs your participation to show strong support for the arts in Maryland and the impact they have on the economic and cultural vitality of the state.

At Maryland Arts Day, you spend the day networking with colleagues from around the state, all while learning about the arts advocacy process.
