ArtsFest 2014 is here! The Charles County Arts Alliance (CCAA) proudly presents ArtsFest 2014 on Saturday, June 7, 2014, from 12:00 noon to 6:00 pm, on the grounds of the La Plata Town Hall. Be there or be square!

This year's event will be our 22nd annual celebration of ALL the arts in Charles County and the Southern Maryland region - performing, visual and literary. We believe this will be the best one yet! Our outdoor festival will present over 45 local artists, 13 performing groups on 2 stages, and 4 special events throughout the day. It's family-friendly fun entertainment, something for everyone, and it's absolutely free! We will have 7 food vendors available as well, selling lots of great "fair food" and ice-cold beverages to keep you well-fed and well-hydrated throughout the day.

Over the past 21 years, our arts festival has been presented in the north, south, west and center of Charles County, to bring the arts to our entire population—suburban, rural and underserved areas. In 1992, our first arts festival was held in Waldorf at the St. Charles Town Center mall, and was named, "A Touch of the Arts." Some years later, we moved it to Cobb Island and renamed it, "Island ArtsFest." Then in 2002, we relocated to Indian Head, and renamed it, "River ArtsFest." In 2012, "ArtsFest" found its new home on the beautiful grounds of the La Plata Town Hall, in the heart of Charles County. We thank the Town of La Plata for our excellent partnership.

Our ArtsFest 2014 special events will be: **"Yoga on the Lawn"** with Anne Machetto at 8:00 am; **"Story Time with Shirley Perez,"** who will read her children's book, *Big Nose*, at 1:00 pm, 3:00 pm and 5:00 pm; our **"Kids Art Tent"** led by Lorina Harris throughout the day; and the **"Daytime Star Party & A Walk Through the Solar System"** led by the Southern Maryland Astronomical Society throughout the day.

## CHARLES COUNTY ARTS ALLIANCE SUPPORTS WALDORF BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT – SPRING KICKOFF 2014

**New “Downtown Waldorf” to Include a Performing Arts Center!**



On a beautiful and sunny Saturday, May 17, 2014, Board members of the Charles County Arts Alliance were among the special guests introduced at the Spring Kickoff of the Waldorf Beautification Project. Arts Alliance President Robert Rausch, Vice President Gale Kladitis, and Past President Diane Rausch were in attendance. This is the second year for this project, whose slogan is, *“With Pride, We Prosper – Help Keep it Clean!”* We have strongly supported this worthy project since it was initiated in 2013 by Charles County Commissioner Vice President Reuben Collins, II. The project is endorsed and sponsored by the Board of County Commissioners.

Last year, the keynote speaker for this event was “native Waldorfian” Diane Rausch, who gave a brief history of Waldorf and emphasized the key role of the arts in enhancing the quality of life and making Waldorf an even better place to live. This year’s keynote speaker was Kim Hill, EdD, Charles County Superintendent of Schools. Dr. Hill spoke of the critical importance of having pride in one’s surroundings and actively seeking partnerships to achieve community goals. She noted that the Charles County Public Schools is proud to be a partner with the Charles County Government in this important initiative to increase the civic pride and community spirit in Waldorf.

The Waldorf Beautification Project is holding its second annual Student Poster Contest in 2014 and the Arts Alliance has been invited to serve as poster judges again in 2014. Board members Gale Kladitis and Lorina Harris will be serving as judges, along with several other members of the community. Student winners of the poster contest will be formally recognized in a ceremony to be held on June 10, 2014, at the Charles County Government Building.

There was outstanding participation in the Spring Kickoff 2014 event by dignitaries, special guests and invited speakers. It included all five County Commissioners, State Senator Thomas “Mac” Middleton, State Delegates Peter Murphy and C.T. Wilson, County Sheriff Rex Coffey, representatives of the Charles County Government and Board of Education, the Charles County Master Gardeners, the Greater Waldorf Jaycees, the St. Charles Companies, and the Greater Malcolm Community. The speakers stressed their commitment to the Waldorf Beautification Project on behalf of their organizations, and gave examples of current activities they were pursuing.

The Charles County Government’s Department of Planning and Growth Management has taken numerous steps over the past year to enhance Waldorf and make it more livable, and many more are planned for the future. Most significantly, the Waldorf Urban Redevelopment Corridor has been formally approved and is commencing implementation. Jason Groth described the exciting plans to create a ‘Downtown Waldorf’ in the historic center (intersection of Routes 5/925), which will include taller buildings, mixed-use, high-density development, wider sidewalks, attractive streetscapes, a large civic park, cafes and pubs, a replica of the historic Waldorf train station, numerous transportation options, and eventually, light rail. This will help to attract and retain young professionals who prefer a more urban, contemporary, diverse and interesting setting in which to live, work and play. The new Waldorf Redevelopment Manager, Landis Faulcon, PhD, expressed her commitment to working closely with community partners on this important project.

**Of major significance to us in the Charles County arts community is the approved plan to build a Performing Arts Center in the center of Waldorf for professional performances and civic use.** This building will anchor one end of the beautiful civic park being planned in the center of Waldorf. We are absolutely thrilled to hear this news!

Creation of a professional Performing Arts Center achieves one of our top recommendations stemming from *Arts Vision 2020: A Strategic Plan for the Arts in Charles County Through the Year 2020*. Many of you reading this were part of the *Arts Vision 2020* stakeholder planning process several years ago, and we thank you again for helping us develop our long-term roadmap for arts development in Charles County. When you meet and greet our County Commissioners, please be sure to thank them for their strong support of the arts in our county – and especially for their leadership and commitment to making our dream of a Performing Arts Center a reality in the years ahead!



We will be closely monitoring the Waldorf Urban Redevelopment Project and plans for our future Performing Arts Center with great interest in the months and years ahead. Rest assured, we will keep you posted on future progress for the “renaissance” of Waldorf!

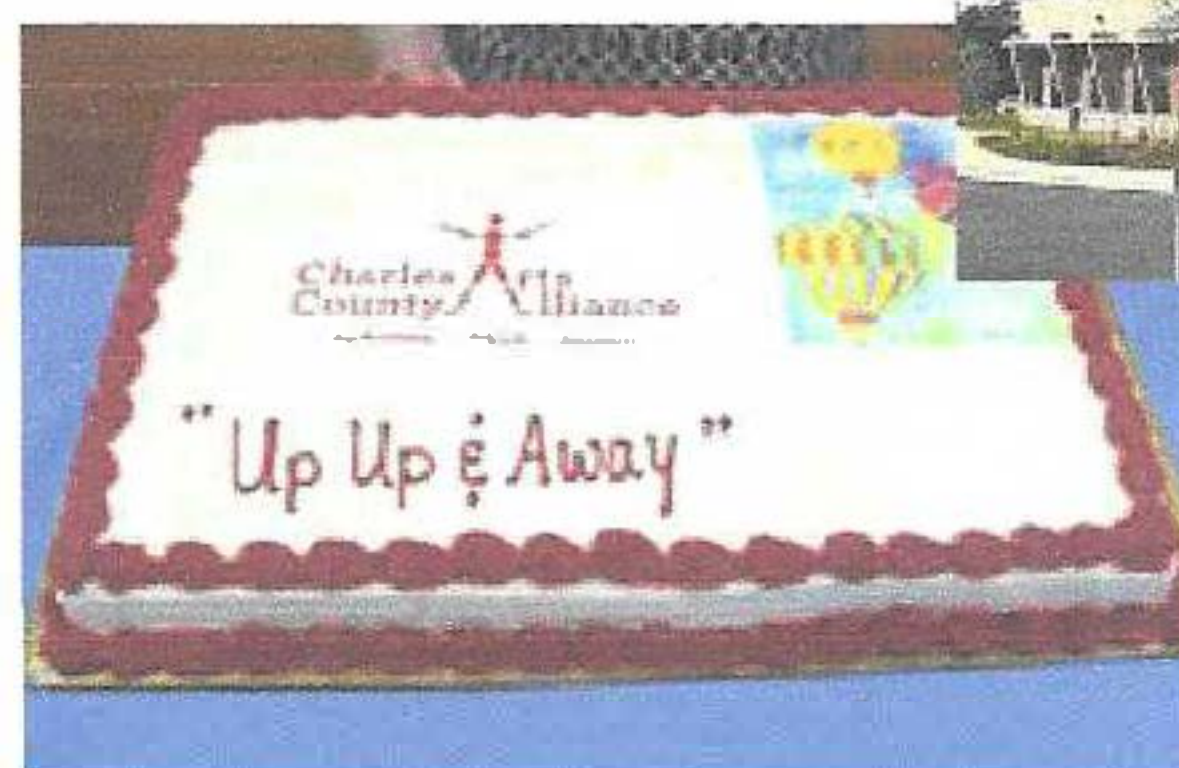




## CCAA Annual Membership Meeting and "Meet the Artists" Public Reception

## 2015 Maryland Individual Artist Awards Guidelines and Webinars Available

The Maryland State Arts Council's annual Individual Artist Award (IAA) recognizes the importance of artists and their works of excellence to the cultural vibrancy of Maryland. Each year, awards of \$1,000, \$3,000 or \$6,000 go to Artists from across Maryland who are selected by a blind, out-of-state jury on the basis of artistic merit alone.

In partnership with the Mid Atlantic Arts Foundation, the IAA program reviews a total of 18 artistic disciplines, which are separated into three competition groups that are awarded triannually.

The 2015 Maryland Individual Artist Award guidelines and application are now available. Applicants must be full-time Maryland residents. The funding categories for 2015 include:

- Non-Classical Music: Composition
- Non-Classical Music: Solo Performance
- Playwriting
- Visual Arts: Crafts
- Visual Arts: Photography

All applications must be submitted online. Applicants can go to <http://www.msac.org/grants/individual-artist-award> to access the guidelines and application. The deadline for 2015 applications is 4:30 pm, on Thursday, July 24, 2014.

The Maryland State Arts Council and Mid Atlantic Arts Foundation will offer three webinars for prospective Individual Artist Award applicants that will:

- Address applicant eligibility, discipline categories, and work sample formats;
- Provide instructions on how to complete the online application; and
- Provide information on the submission of digital images for visual artists
- Advance registration is required.
