

Charles County Arts Alliance Invited to Kickoff New WALDORF BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT!

On a beautiful sunny and windy Saturday, March 23, 2013, the Charles County Arts Alliance participated in the Charles County Government's official News Conference to kick off an exciting new project spearheaded by Charles County Commissioner Reuben Collins and sponsored by all County Commissioners: The Waldorf Beautification Project. This project has been the vision of Commissioner Collins for many years as a means to unite Waldorf as one town, and instill a true sense of community and civic pride among its residents. This project is the first step of a long-term strategy to improve the quality of life for Waldorf citizens.

The News Conference took place at the Park & Ride parking lot at the corner of Route 301 south and Smallwood Drive, and was attended by over 75 people, including Commissioners Reuben Collins, Debra Davis, Ken Robinson and Bobby Rucci; County Government employees; representatives of Waldorf community organizations, including the Friends of Old Waldorf School, St. Charles neighborhoods; and concerned citizens. The County's hybrid car was on display, and free anti-litter bags and small seedling crabapple and dogwood trees were provided to participants.

CCAA President Diane Rausch was invited to be the first kickoff speaker for this event. She was asked to speak on three topics: the Charles County Arts Alliance, her own Berry family connection to Waldorf for over 300 years, and a short history of Waldorf. An excerpt of her remarks pertaining to the CCAA are provided below:

"First, I'd like to talk about the Charles County Arts Alliance. We are a nonprofit, 501-c-3 membership organization devoted to promoting all the arts in Charles County: music, visual art, drama, dance and literature. Our mission is to

The CCAA was blessed with two terrific honors this past month: an invitation from Maryland State Arts Council to testify at the Senate Finance Committee hearing of the Maryland General Assembly in support of the Maryland Public Art "Percent for Art" Bill (SB-702) on March 5; and an invitation to serve as the kickoff speaker at the News Conference for the new Waldorf Beautification Project on March 23. As CCAA President, I was truly honored to have the opportunity to express our strong endorsement for Public Art legislation for Maryland, and to express our strong support of this new Waldorf initiative of Commissioner Reuben Collins, and all the Charles County Commissioners. You'll recall that our own Arts Vision 2020 strategic plan supports both Public Art and enhanced quality of life in Charles County, so these two events were excellent opportunities to go on record and endorse these important initiatives.

Looking ahead, we have many activities on the horizon, including our participation in the *Celebrate La Plata Day* outdoor festival on Sunday, April 27, from 12:00 – 4:00 pm. Look for our CCAA white popup tent — we'll be

there! We really enjoy promoting our arts organization to the broader community and meeting/greeting old and new friends. We love the location, and it's great fun being outside and soaking up all that fresh air and sunshine after being cooped up all winter. Hope to see you there!

Then, on Saturday, May 4, from 1:00 – 3:00 pm, we will hold our *CCAA Annual Membership Reception and Meeting*. Please mark your calendars, and plan to join us! This year we have a brand-new venue for our annual gathering . . . the brand-new Waldorf West Library! We are so pleased with our new partnership with the Charles County Public Library. It has been an honor and a privilege to manage four separate gallery spaces at the new library: in the large multipurpose room on the first floor, and in 2 study rooms and a lovely open wall space on the second floor. Have you visited this library yet? It is definitely worth a trip – it is gorgeous, a work of art in its own right! It is a state of the art, LEED-certified, ultra modern, highly functional, beautifully designed, architectural masterpiece – and its ours, a Charles County showpiece!

Our May 4 annual meeting will have refreshments, reports from our Board members, elections for the new Board for 2013-2015, and live musical entertainment by Greg Nichols. Greg is the fabulous pianist that performed for us during our *CCAA 25th Anniversary Gala* last November 2012 at the Old Waldorf School! He performs at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in NYC when he's not performing for us in Waldorf, MD! Then at 3:00 pm, we will open up our event to the public, when we will host our "meet the artists" reception. We have 21 local visual artists on display right now at Waldorf West Library, and here is your chance to meet them in person. Please be on the lookout for your invitations coming in the mail in the near future. Look forward to seeing you there!



stimulate, promote, encourage and provide recognition of the arts and the creative spirit in Charles County. We are the "chamber of commerce" for the arts! We have many programs that we carry out throughout the year: grants to arts organizations and schools, scholarships, an annual countywide ArtsFest each year, and our newest project takes place right here in Waldorf!

Last November, we launched a new long-term partnership with the Charles County Public Library: to create and manage 4 separate galleries at the brand-new Waldorf West Library. It is a wonderful partnership, and we are currently displaying artworks of 21 local Charles County artists. It is a fabulous exhibit – stop by Waldorf West on your way home, and please come by and "meet the artists" at our upcoming public reception there on Saturday, May 4 at 3:00 pm. Literacy Council Offers Tutor Training Workshop







Maryland Artist/Teacher Institute (MATI)

July 8 - 12, 2013

Working in partnership with the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) and the Maryland State Arts Council (MSAC), Arts Education in Maryland Schools (AEMS) Alliance administers the Maryland Artist/Teacher Institute (MATI). Established in 1994, MATI is an intensive professional development summer program for elementary and middle school teachers and administrators that is conducted by master teachers, artists, and artist-educators in a residential university setting, with follow-up throughout the academic year.

Through lectures, seminars, and workshops, teachers are provided with opportunities to enhance their knowledge of the relationships among content areas and of ways that the arts can be used to integrate curriculum, content, processes, and skills. Cross-disciplinary teams examine various models for integrating the arts into the school curriculum. The teams participate in hands-on workshops to become more familiar with creative processes and to develop an understanding of the continuous interaction that occurs among the arts and other content areas. Participants begin the planning process for integrating the arts into instruction at their sites and sharing their work with colleagues. Designed and developed by the MSDE, MATI is co-funded by the National Endowment for the Arts.

MATI is to be held again this summer at the Inn and Conference Center at the University of Maryland University College in Adelphi, Maryland.
