Maryland Arts Day Almost Here!

Maryland Citizens for the Arts (MCA) will hold the 15th Maryland Arts Day in Annapolis on Wednesday, February 20, 2013, from 9:00 am - 2:00 pm, and you are invited! Maryland Arts Day is the most

important arts advocacy event of the year in Maryland, bringing the many, varied voices of the artistic community together in support of state funding for the arts and the Maryland State Arts Council. The event acts as the only state-wide annual meeting for the Maryland arts community and its supporters, and as such presents a unique networking opportunity and a platform to discuss issues specific to the arts.

The Charles County Arts Alliance (CCAA) will join representatives from arts councils and organizations across the state to advocate for funding of the arts in Maryland.

This year's keynote speaker is world renowned surgeon, research, teacher and musician, Dr. Charles Limb, Associate Professor, Otolaryngology-Head & Neck Surgery at Johns Hopkins University and Faculty, Peabody Conservatory of Music. The connection Dr. Limb is making between the arts and the development of the human brain is breaking new ground and we look forward to hearing about his work on this interesting subject.

Matt Wigler Jazz Trio will play a set during lunch as we process the experience of the delegation meetings with our lawmakers. Matt Wigler is a remarkable young pianist and composer who fell in love with jazz and blues at age eight, and since then has made a name for himself at festivals and venues throughout the United States.

The registration fee for Maryland Arts Day is \$50 and includes: parking, breakfast, lunch, performances, and speakers. There is an "early bird" discount of \$15 for those who register by February 6, 2013, so don't delay! If you need a ride to Annapolis on February 20, please call the CCAA Office and let us know. There has been an explosion of arts events and opportunities this winter in Charles County . . . please take a look at this month's newsletter and you'll see what I mean. Unlike our groundhog friend, no one is hibernating here! There are so many interesting and creative outlets for Charles County citizens to experience all the arts firsthand — performing, visual and literary. As the "arts umbrella" organization for our county, we have a key role in promoting these events and assisting the presenting organizations in building their audiences. We want to spread the word far and wide that the arts are alive and thriving in Charles County. Please demonstrate your support for these artistic endeavors by attending upcoming performances in music, drama, dance, by visiting our various galleries, by joining book clubs and attending literary events in and around our county. There is something for everyone!

This past month, January, has been a month of introspection, future planning and grant-writing. As most of you know, our organization receives financial support from two main grant sources: the Maryland State Arts Council and the Charles County Government. So in addition to the CCAA grants we award to nonprofit organizations and schools each year (over \$39,000 this year), we also apply for grants ourselves. It takes grant money to award grant money! Our annual grant-writing is a major undertaking and a critically important one. Without grant support from our State and County governments, our annual arts programming and our own CCAA arts grant program would simply be impossible.

This coming month, February, we are looking forward to continuing our future planning with our upcoming Board Midwinter Retreat. It is one of two opportunities throughout the year for the CCAA Board of Directors to spend an entire day together . . . stepping back, thinking deep thoughts, assessing our progress, and charting our operations, projects and outcomes for the future. It is also a time in which we frankly discuss our successes and our challenges, with the objective of continuous improvement of our nonprofit organization. We want to ensure we accomplish our current goals, and set new exciting goals for the future.

Looking ahead, one of my favorite events is coming up on February 20, 2013: *Maryland Arts Day* in Annapolis. Each year I take a day off from work to go to Annapolis and demonstrate my personal support for the arts in Maryland, and the Maryland State Arts Council (MSAC). CCAA Board and Staff members join me — it is a great field-trip and great fun! This year, we are supporting Governor O'Malley's fantastic FY 2014 Budget Request that includes a \$2 million increase in the budget of the MSAC! Over 400 other arts enthusiasts are in attendance from across the state, and there are inspiring keynote speakers, great performances, and networking opportunities as well. It is a truly awesome day.

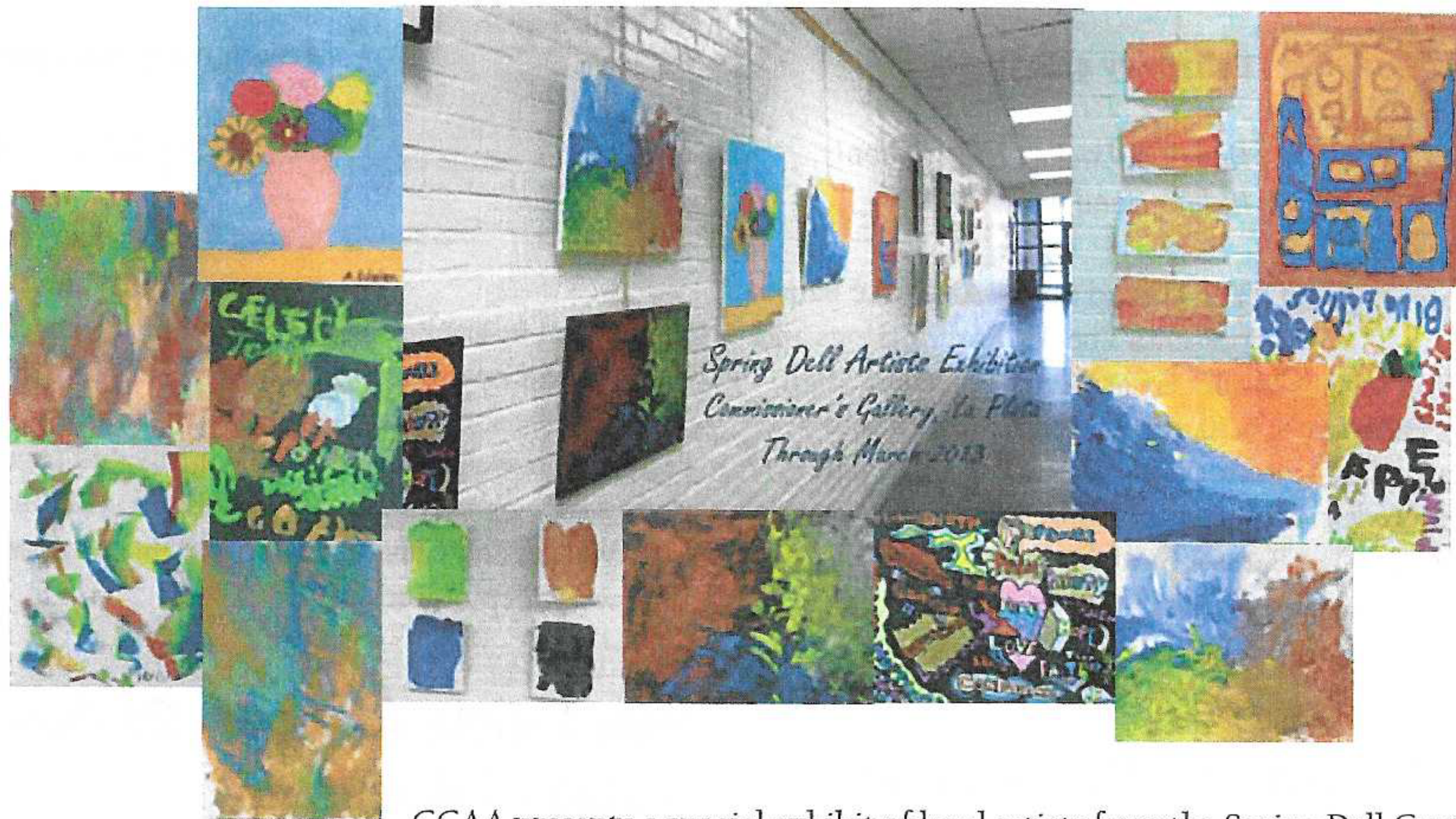

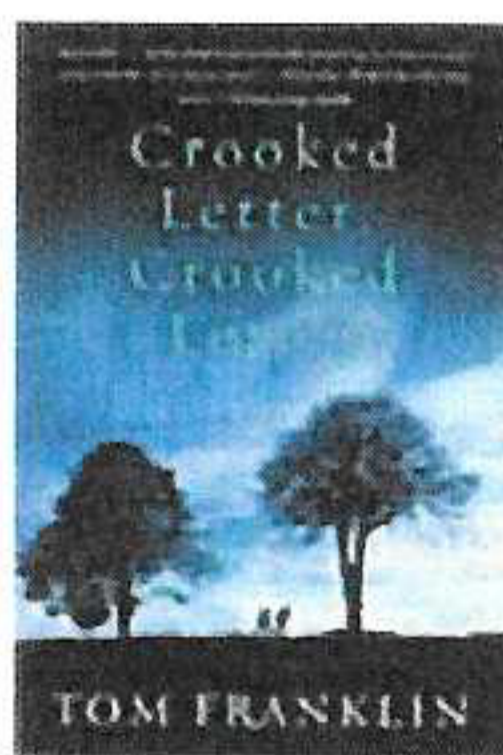
altogether and instead relies on primordial instincts and the lessons he has learned to become a respected and feared leader in the wild.

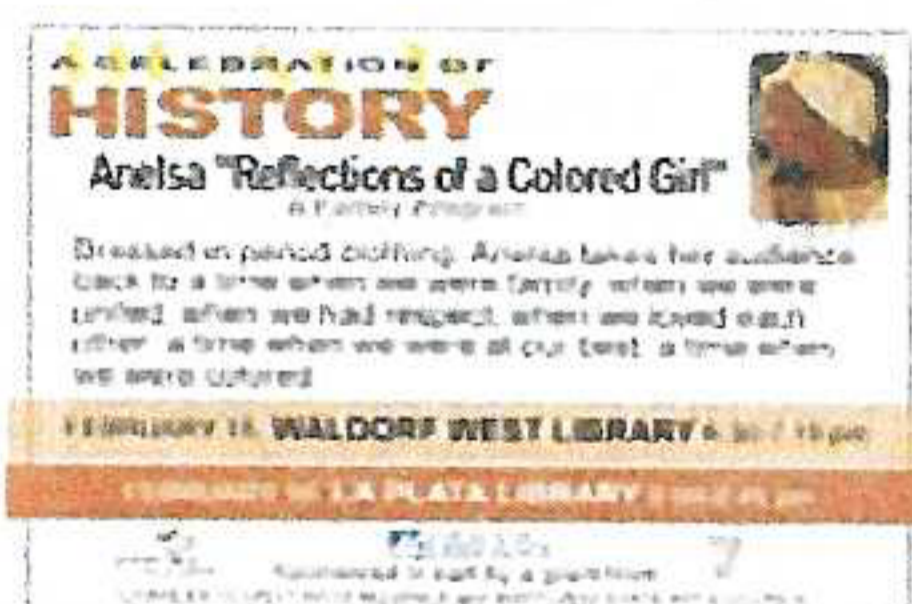

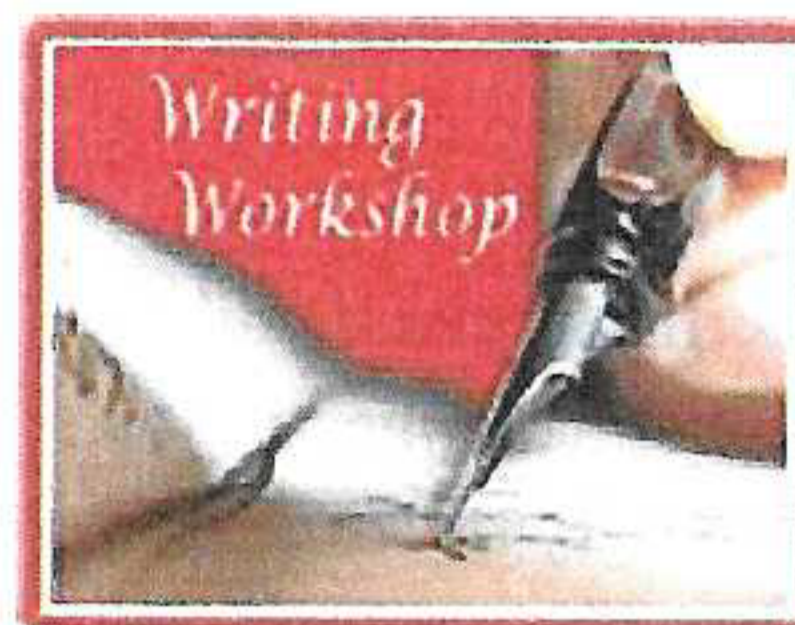

Southern Maryland children are being challenged to read 500 books by the time they turn five. The program, called

500x5, is a partnership between Charles County Public Library, Calvert Library, St. Mary's County Library, and the Southern Maryland Regional Library Association to challenge young children and their parents to make reading a fun family habit.

Think about this: just one book a day equals 730 books in two years. If a child attends library story time from birth, he or she will easily reach 500 books by five years old.

A monotype is a one-of-a-kind print where the paint (oil paint, oil-based ink or watercolor) is applied directly to a printing plate, and then the paint is transferred to the printing paper by running the plate and paper through a press. Beginners are welcome. Instructor Harriett Lawler who focuses on printmaking has taken classes with master printer Allan Kaneshiro, who was the Resident Artist at the National Museum of American Art. Fee: \$40 for MCAC members and \$50 for nonmembers. Please note that registrations received one week in advance of the workshop will receive a \$10 discount. If you sign up for both sessions, the cost is \$60 for MCAC members and \$80 for nonmembers.

Photographs, paintings, sketches or other artistic renderings of found object art that do not actually incorporate the found object are not eligible. All work and entries must comply with MFA

Exhibition Guidelines. One-two entries \$35 (MFA members \$20), additional four entries \$5.00 each.

Governor O'Malley ... on the Side of the Arts!

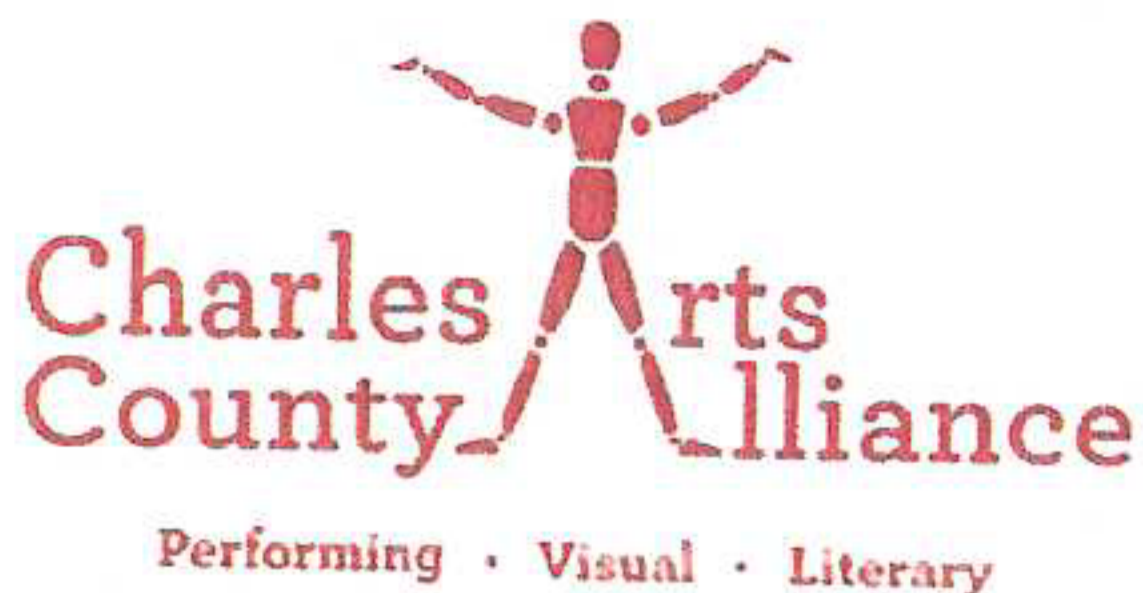
— Presented Public Leadership in the Arts Award —

Americans for the Arts presented Maryland Governor Martin O'Malley with the "Public Leadership in the Arts" award at the annual meeting of the US Conference of Mayors in Washington DC in January. Governor O'Malley is the only person to win this award twice, he won it as Mayor of Baltimore several years ago. In his remarks, the Governor touted the proposal to increase arts funding in his FY 2014 budget because, he said, "in Maryland we're about doing more... More Jobs and More Art!"

O'Malley's fiscal year 2014 Operating Budget includes an increase of \$2 million over FY 2013. The appropriation of \$15.2 million, if passed, will be the largest operating budget appropriation made in the history of the Maryland State Arts Council. After three years of level funding which carried the arts sector in Maryland through turbulent economic times, there is hope that this increase, once secured, will bring much needed relief to arts organizations that continue to struggle throughout the state.
