Dear Members and Friends,

Happy March! Spring is just around the corner now . . . we finally made it through the cold, blustery Winter!

It's an incredibly invigorating time for the Charles County Arts Alliance. Just three weeks ago, we held our second retreat of the year, our Board Midwinter Retreat, on Saturday, February 9, in Solomons. It was a great day together, with a very productive and enlightening set of discussions. We discussed the past, present, and future of our organization, evaluated our recent performance during the first half of our year, identified and resolved various issues, and planned the remaining months of our year, which ends on June 30. Thanks to all the Board members for their active, constructive participation in this retreat.

One of the most important discussion items that took place during our retreat was a discussion of our upcoming vacancy for our part-time CCAA Office Manager. After 2.5 years of dedicated support of our nonprofit organization, Wendy Fuller has accepted a full-time position in Alexandria, Virginia. Wendy officially departed our organization at the end of February. We are so very sorry to see her go. She has been a wonderful, positive, and excellent addition to our organization, and we will miss her very much — her professionalism, her kindness, and her warm friendship. Hence, now we are in transition until a new Office Manager is hired and in place . . . so please bear with us! CCAA Board members are assuming many of Wendy's duties during this interim, but Wendy has graciously agreed to keep those Arts Newsflashes of ours going out each week until her replacement is found. Thank you Wendy for your many fine contributions during your time with us, and best wishes for continued success in your new position!

As you know, we have been actively advertising and recruiting during February for our new Office Manager. The deadline for receipt of all applications and resumes is today (March 1). Please see the Vacancy Announcement on page 3 for further information. If you know someone who might be interested and be a good fit for our

organization, please let them know about this immediately — you'll need to move extremely quickly since today is the deadline!

Looking ahead, we are gearing up for our CCAA Annual Membership Meeting/Reception on Saturday afternoon, May 4, 1:00 - 3:00 pm. It will be held at the new Waldorf West Library in the main gallery (multipurpose room, first floor). We are pleased to hold this meeting in our newest gallery space, so you will be surrounded by our latest art show. Please come out and view our second multi-media exhibition, enjoy refreshments and live entertainment, hear annual reports from Board members, etc. Two of the most important aspects of this year's annual business meeting are: (1) elections and appointments of the new Board for FY 2013-2015; and (2) Bylaw amendments. If you are interested in being considered for the new Board, the self-nominations process is now open. We will need to hear from you by the March 15 deadline. After that our Nominations Committee will meet, consider applicants, and develop the final recommended slate of nominees. See page 4 for details and self-nomination requirements. Also during our May 4 meeting, we will have some proposed CCAA Bylaw amendments for your consideration.

Looking even further ahead, ArtsFest 2013 is coming soon! Hard to believe, but it is only three months away. The CCAA will again present ArtsFest 2013 at the La Plata Town Hall. We had a wonderful time there last year, and were warmly welcomed by the Mayor, Town Council, and Town Staff. We're looking forward to an even bigger and better event this year, our 21st Annual ArtsFest. Our ArtsFest 2013 Committee is led by Bill Adams, Cindy Johnson, and Bob Rausch. They are busily engaged in ensuring that ArtsFest 2013 is best year yet for this "grand finale" of our CCAA year.

Do you qualify?

Nominations for Officers must be CCAA current members (dues paid) as of January 1, 2013.  - —Serve on a "hands-on" Board; it is not an advisory group.


Four separate gallery spaces are located within Waldorf West Library and include a large conference room, two study rooms, and wall space in the Fiction section.

Charles County Arts Alliance Receives CSM Trustees' Distinguished Service Award



On Friday evening, January 18, 2013, the Charles County Arts Alliance (CCAA) was honored to receive the College of Southern Maryland (CSM) Trustees' Distinguished Service Award. The award was presented by Austin J. Slater, Chair of the CSM Board of Trustees, during the CSM Winter Commencement at its La Plata campus.

The CCAA was one of three county arts councils in Southern Maryland selected for this high achievement. In addition, the Arts Council of Calvert County and the St. Mary's County Arts Council were similarly recognized. The three arts councils were recognized for their support of CSM arts programming which has allowed a variety of programming to be offered to a regional audience on their three campuses: in La Plata, Prince Frederick, and Leonardtown. Over \$35,000 in funding support from the three county arts councils has been provided for CSM arts programming over the past several years.

CCAA President Diane Rausch and Calvert County Arts Council Treasurer Robert Carpenter accepted the award on behalf of their respective organizations. St. Mary's County Arts Council President Michael Brown was unable to attend. The award consisted of a unique rosewood engraved plaque and clock in the shape of a book.

The CSM Winter Commencement ceremony involved over 600 graduates receiving Associate's Degrees. In addition, the 20,000th graduate of CSM was recognized during the event.

The CCAA wishes to express its sincere appreciation to the CSM Board of Trustees for this very high honor. We also wish to convey our gratitude to CSM President Dr. Bradley Gottfried. We extend our very best wishes to CSM for continued excellent arts programming in the future that benefits the citizens of Southern Maryland and contributes significantly to our enhanced quality of life.



CCAA Advocates for the Arts at Maryland Arts Day



Maryland Arts Day 2013

Charles County Arts Alliance Joins Over 300 Statewide Arts Advocates in Annapolis

On Wednesday, February 20, 2013, four members of the CCAA Board of Directors headed to Annapolis to demonstrate their strong support for the arts at Maryland Arts Day 2013. CCAA Board members Diane Rausch, Lorina Harris, Roy Jenkins, and Kenny Waters were joined by over 300 fellow arts advocates from across the state.

This annual event is sponsored by Maryland Citizens for the Arts (MCA), of which the CCAA is a member. MCA Executive Director John Schratwieser led statewide efforts to present this outstanding event, and served as the day's emcee. Numerous elected officials greeted the arts advocates, including State Senate President Mike Miller and Maryland Lt. Gov. Anthony Brown. A special treat was the invited keynote speaker, Dr. Charles Limb, who serves as Associate Professor of Otolaryngology at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, and simultaneously serves as a Faculty Member at Peabody Conservatory of Music! He spoke on his fascinating scientific research assessing the effects of jazz improvisation on the human brain.

Advocates spent the day stressing the importance of arts funding with individual members of the Maryland General Assembly. The main source of CCAA grant funding is the Maryland State Arts Council (MSAC), and for FY 2014, Governor Martin O'Malley has requested a terrific \$2 million increase for the MSAC, from \$13.2 to \$15.2 million. They had a simple, straightforward message to communicate to our elected state legislators: "Please don't cut Gov. O'Malley's proposed FY 2014 budget for the MSAC." A second message they delivered was: "Please support the proposed Percent for Art Bill which sets aside 1% in capital construction costs of future state-funded buildings for Public Art."

The theme for the day was "sustainability," and included in-depth dialogue to ensure that the CCAA is on a strong trajectory for continued growth, enhanced organizational capacity, and increased arts programming to benefit the citizens of Charles County in the future.

Discussion topics included: strategic planning, the scholarship program, rollout of the proposed FY 2014 operating budget, Board nominations, Bylaw revisions, the upcoming Office Manager vacancy, standard operating procedures, organizational efficiencies, and planning for the remaining CCAA programs, projects and events of FY 2013.


Pat Harrington is back with a new romance, Janie's Got a New Job. This well-crafted romance places Janie Montgomery at a crossroads in her life. She quits her day



Maryland Artist/Teacher Institute (MATI)

Working in partnership with the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) and the Maryland State Arts Council (MSAC), Arts Education in Maryland Schools (AEMS) Alliance administers the Maryland Artist/Teacher Institute (MATI). Established in 1994, MATI is an intensive professional development summer program for elementary and middle school teachers and administrators that is conducted by master teachers, artists, and artist-educators in a residential university setting, with follow-up throughout the academic year.

Through lectures, seminars, and workshops, teachers are provided with opportunities to enhance their knowledge of the relationships among content areas and of ways that the arts can be used to integrate curriculum, content, processes, and skills. Cross-disciplinary teams examine various models for integrating the arts into the school curriculum. The teams participate in hands-on workshops to become more familiar with creative processes and to develop an understanding of the continuous interaction that occurs among the arts and other content areas. Participants begin the planning process for integrating the arts into instruction at their sites and sharing their work with colleagues. Designed and developed by the MSDE, MATI is co-funded by the National Endowment for the Arts.
