Waldorf West Gallery a Perfect Setting for Year-End Event

On Saturday, May 4, 2013, the Charles County Arts Alliance (CCAA) hosted its Annual Membership Meeting and Reception at the new, beautiful Waldorf West Library Gallery. It was a perfect setting for a fabulous event celebrating the conclusion of another highly successful year for the CCAA – our best year yet in our 25-year history!

The event opened with social time, with mixing and mingling among members. CCAA Office Manager Judy Crawford greeted members upon arrival, and shortly thereafter, the annual business meeting was called to order by CCAA President Diane Rausch. She welcomed members and special guests, and introduced Emily Ferren, Director of the Charles County Public Library (CCPL). Emily welcomed attendees to Waldorf West, and thanked the CCAA for its initiative and wonderful partnership that developed the four active art gallery spaces there. Emily, the CCPL Board of Trustees, and Waldorf West Branch Manager Janet Salazar then presented the CCAA with a special Certificate of Appreciation that read:

"In recognition of their inspiration and dedication to sponsor public art at the Waldorf West branch of the Charles County Public Library. Thank you for making a difference."

Invited guest Pamela Dunne, Program Director for Community Arts Development, Maryland State Arts Council (MSAC) brought greetings from the MSAC in Baltimore. She announced the outstanding news that the Maryland General Assembly and Governor O'Malley had increased the FY 2014 budget for the MSAC by \$2,000,000 (15%), and thanked the CCAA for its advocacy of the arts at the state level.

The Charles County Arts Alliance (CCAA) will hold ArtsFest 2013 on Saturday, June 8, 2013, from 12:00 noon - 6:00 pm, at the La Plata Town Hall! Now in its 21st year, this annual countywide outdoor event celebrates ALL the arts in Charles County: music, visual art, drama, dance and literature. ArtsFest returns to La Plata this year and will once again bring the festivities to the lawn surrounding the beautiful La Plata Town Hall. Previous ArtsFests have been held in Indian Head, Cobb Island and Waldorf.

It's not too late to register for ArtsFest 2013! Please join us for the largest outdoor arts festival in Charles County. Last year over 2,000 citizens attended ArtsFest, and this year promises to be even bigger and better! We are pleased to announce we have extended the deadline for artists and exhibitors. After May 10, a late registration fee of \$10 is required. The booth registration form is located at our website: www.charlescountyarts.org.

Visual artists of all media are invited to sell artworks on the lawn at ArtsFest 2013. In addition, arts organizations are invited as exhibitors to display information and encourage participation in their performing, visual and literary arts activities. You still have time to submit your artwork! Computer issues delayed on-line submission, so the date has been extended to May 20, 2013.

We are pleased to announce the third public art exhibit at the new Waldorf West Library. This multimedia exhibit will be held from July 2 - September 30, 2013. The Waldorf West Library Gallery consists of four separate gallery spaces on two floors.

The upcoming show will center around a horticultural theme. According to Webster's Dictionary, "horticulture" is the art and science of growing fruits, vegetables, flowers, or ornamental plants. This upcoming art exhibit seeks to explore the breadth and depth of nature's bounty and beauty in Charles County. Charles County's heritage has rural roots, with traditional farming a focal point of the local economy. In addition, gardening is the number-one hobby today in the United States, and is increasing in popularity every year.

Local artists are invited to submit a maximum of two artworks to the Charles County Arts Alliance for consideration (there is no submission fee). Artwork entries must be submitted electronically as low-resolution digital images (jpegs) attached to an email sent to waldorfwestgallery@gmail.com. Entries should include artist's name, title of artwork, medium/materials used, size/dimension, year created, and price if applicable. Artists who have previously shown in the gallery are invited to submit new work for consideration. 
























Charles County Arts Alliance to Announce Winners of the 2013 Arts Scholarship Program

Graduation time is coming!


The Charles County Arts Alliance sponsors an Arts Scholarship Program, which awards a \$1000 scholarship to an outstanding graduate at each Charles County public high school and the College of Southern Maryland (CSM). The scholarships are designated for students planning to attend a four-year college or university in fall 2013, and majoring in the performing, visual or literary arts leading to a professional career in the arts.

The Arts Alliance will publicly announce the winners of its annual Arts Scholarship Program, during the upcoming Senior Awards Nights at the county high schools in late May/early June. The CSM graduate recipient will be notified by letter.

The Alliance's Arts Scholarship Program commenced in 1999, and to date has supported the higher education academic pursuits of over 50 talented and creative Charles County students in music, visual art, drama, dance and literature.

CCAA Education Committee Chair Kathleen Jenkins stated, "The Charles County Arts Alliance is very pleased that we can support those students who are interested in majoring in the arts at college. 


June 13: Unbroken by Laura Hillenbrand On a May afternoon in 1943, an Army Air Forces bomber crashed into the Pacific Ocean and disappeared, leaving only a spray of debris and a slick of oil, gasoline, and blood.

Then, on the ocean surface, a face appeared. It was that of a young lieutenant, the plane's bombardier, who was strug-

gling to a life raft and pulling himself aboard. So began one of the most extraordinary odysseys of the Second World War. This is the true story of Louis Zamperini, from his boyhood as a cunning and incorrigible delinquent, to channeling his defiance to become an Olympic runner, to his faith and fight for survival as a prisoner of war. Driven to the limits of endurance, Zamperini would answer desperation with ingenuity; suffering with hope, resolve, and humor; brutality with rebellion. His fate, whether triumph or tragedy, would be suspended on the fraying wire of his will.
