CCAA FY 2025 Grant Season Closing Soon

Charles County Arts Alliance FY 2025 Grant Season is Closing Soon

The CCAA is reminding our community nonprofit organizations and schools that our FY 2025 Community Arts Development (CAD) and Arts In Education (AIE) grant applications are due on Thursday, October 10, 2024, by NLT 12:00 noon. Since our founding in 1987, the CAD/AIE Grant Program has been a focal point of our mission. We have awarded to date, over \$1 million dollars to deserving nonprofit organizations and schools in Charles County to enhance their planned programs, projects, events and activities.


In FY 2024, the CCAA awarded over \$103,000 in grants to 15 organizations, 22 schools, and the Charles County Board of Education. These funds have been instrumental in enriching the cultural fabric of our community, supporting artistic excellence, and expanding access to the arts for all residents.

A Competitive and Rigorous Grant Process

Our grant program is highly competitive, and all decisions are made through a meticulous process. Applicants must submit a formal grant application, which is then rated and ranked by the CCAA Grant Committee before receiving final approval from the CCAA Board of Directors. One key requirement is that all applicants provide a cash match for any requested grant funds, with ratios ranging from 1:1 to 3:1, depending on the grant amount requested.

Grants are evaluated based on three main criteria:

- Artistic Merit
- Organizational Effectiveness
- Service to the Community

Applications for FY 2025 grants will be accepted through Thursday, October 10, 2024, by NLT 12:00 noon. Please note that all grant applications must be received in the CCAA Office by this time (not postmarked). We encourage all eligible organizations and schools in Charles County to apply and take advantage of this opportunity to secure funding for their artistic initiatives. At our vibrant table, we shared our goody bags with Fairgoers and highlighted our latest editions of our Arts NewsFlash and Arts Insider. We enjoy connecting with new subscribers and spreading the word about all things arts-related in our community. CCAA staff members Alexandria Gonzalez and Mackenzie Coulby were happy to reconnect with Gallery Committee co-chairs Gale Kladitis and Cindi Barnhart. They reminisced about the Fair's rich history, sharing stories that have shaped this beloved event over the years.





Adding a unique touch to our display, Gale and Mackenzie got creative by showcasing our goody bags on a crab net salvaged from the Chesapeake Bay. This eye-catching installation not only highlighted our connection to the local environment but also drew in curious visitors, sparking conversations about the arts and our CCAA programs.

The weather during the three-day Fair was absolutely perfect, adding to the joy of the experience. It was a fantastic opportunity to connect with fellow art enthusiasts and share the love of creativity that thrives in Charles County. CCAA "Back to School" Art Boxes

The Arts Alliance summer project was assembling art boxes for the Children's Aid Society. Last year, we were able to get prepackaged art boxes from Staples for \$10 each. This year we used Dollar Tree.

Yvette, the manager of the local Dollar Tree store in La Plata, was most helpful. Dollar Tree had "back to school" supplies for \$1.25 each, including boxes to put them in, with online ordering for batches of 24. Some boxes could be delivered to the local store for no shipping costs, and others we had to pay UPS costs. We also got our CCAA tax exemption registered online, so there was no need to pay Maryland sales tax. So, despite delays with getting the tax exemption approved, and shipping delays, we got the whole package together by September 9. Lew and Karen McIntyre, Ron Brown, Joselle Gilpin, and Alexandria Gonzalez packed out 192 art boxes, and delivered them to the Children's Aid Society in Waldorf on September 10.

Despite some last-minute SNAFUs, we managed to continue our CCAA 20-year Art Boxes project unbroken.



Most clubs operate in a workshop format so that teens can share their writing and get feedback from their peers. Leaders offer guidance and advice, writing exercises, and constructive criticism.

Each April, visitors from all over are invited to explore hundreds of artist studios and creative spaces throughout Maryland — free of charge. Featured exhibitions, demos, and artist talks connect artists with the public and highlight each neighborhood's unique flavor and contributions to Maryland's artistic vibrancy.
